Programs

Canine Influenza: The Petfinder.com Foundation partnered with Intervet/Schering-Plough to award Canine Influenza vaccinations to Petfinder.com members. Canine Influenza when spread throughout a shelter can be devastating, by providing product grants to members across the country, the Foundation is able to further its mission by reducing illness and increasing adoptable pets.

Total Grants Awarded: 2.6 Million dollars to 161 shelters

Train to Adopt: The Foundation joined forces with Sue Sternberg to assist four shelters with creating a training program within their shelter. Four pilot shelters were selected to hire trainers, have those trainers professionally trained by Sue Sternberg, and then implement those training skills within their shelter walls. In addition to training the trainers to work with staff, volunteers, and dogs, the Foundation is working with the directors at the shelter to engage them in fundraising to make the trainer position a permanent fixture at the shelter. By providing training care and attention to shelter dogs, the Foundation is assisting with decreasing less than desirable adoption behavior and increasing adoption rates.

Total Grants Awarded: \$160,000 to 4 Shelters

Vaccination Grants: *Dog Vaccination:* Bordetella vaccinations are awarded to Petfinder.com members to assist with decreasing the amount of cases of bordetella seen in shelter facilities. Bordetella is a deadly disease, that when spread throughout a shelter leads to euthanasia of many otherwise adoptable dogs. *Cat Vaccination:* Feline Viral Rhinotracheitis, Calicivirus, Panleukopenia (FVRCP) vaccinations are awarded to Petfinder.com members to assist them with decreasing the number of cases of FVRCP seen in shelters. By providing cat vaccinations, the Foundation is able to assist with increasing healthy cats within the shelters and decreasing illness.

Total Grants Awarded: \$68,000.00 in Bordetella to 7 shelters; \$146,100 in FVRCP to 79 shelters

Shelter Challenge: The Foundation is a nonprofit partner in The Animal Rescue Site's family of charitable organizations. The Animal Rescue Site is part of the GreaterGood.org Network, which supports selected charities through their daily free clicks program. One of these program is the Shelter Challenge, in which Petfinder.com members receive votes for their shelter. Each week the a shelter is selected to win \$1000.00. At the end of the Shelter Challenge Term, each state is awarded a \$1000.00 winner along with top prizes ranging from \$10,000.00 to \$1,000.00.

Total Grants Awarded in 2010: \$298,000.00 to over 200 Petfinder.com members

Hide, Perch and Go: The Hide, Perch and Go cat box is provided by assistance from the Animal Rescue Site and The PETCO Foundation, as well as other organizations

such as the CATalyst Council. Shelter life can be scary for cats. The transition from an original home to shelter life to an adoptive home brings many changes in sights, smells and surroundings, leaving cats fearful of each situation. The HPG box when used at a shelter gives a cat control over her environment, allowing her to relax and become more adoptable. The box then follows the cat to her new home, giving her a familiar environment during the adjustment period. The box in turn provides a healthier cat and decreased returns.

Total Grants Awarded: \$318,000 to 49 shelters. 164 pallets, totaling 59,040 boxes.

Blue Sky: The Foundation has partnered with Hansen, Blue Sky soda to support adoption across the country. The Foundation will be working with Hansen Soda to promote Blue Sky through Facebook contests, Soda Tap returns, and other promotions. By assisting shelters with grants to support adoption, the Foundation is furthering its mission to increase adoption in adoptable pets.

Total Grants Awarded: \$5,000.00 to 5 shelters

Sponsor A Pet: The Sponsor A Pet program was designed to empower shelters to raise money. It is also a way for a member of the public to assist homeless animals even if they do not have the ability to adopt. Currently, a shelter signs up through the program and an icon is placed on their adoptable pet's pages on Petfinder.com. Once a quarter the Petfinder.com Foundation batches donations to these shelters manually. In an effort to vamp the program and assist shelters with reaching new goals in raising money, the Foundation is developing the program to work as a basic affiliate program. Where once a quarter we download a report, send it out to a third party and they distribute checks and/or distribute directly to banking accounts.

Total Grants Awarded in 2010: \$133,745.00, 3380 donations total to over 1500 shelters

Disaster Grants: The Petfinder.com Foundation is committed to both assisting with Disaster preparedness and relief. Disaster preparedness grants provide support to Petfinder.com members before a disaster strikes. The Foundation awards grants to provide emergency equipment and/or supplies such as generators and wiring for such tools to assist shelters with preparing for the event of a disaster. Funds are used to offer animal-related resources and assistance during and after significant natural or man-made disasters. The Petfinder.com Foundation awards grants to provide emergency equipment or supplies, physical improvements to the animal shelters and property, animal transport and housing equipment allocated for use in the event of a disaster, file and records management systems, and training for staff and/or volunteers who are critical responders for the organizations during an emergency. The disaster program also specially reaches out to large man made or natural disasters. In cases such as large, devastating earthquakes or oil spills the Foundation assists Petfinder.com members with grants to recover.

Total Grants Awarded in 2010: \$122,850 to 39 shelters

Rescue University: The Foundation sponsor trips of student volunteers from Rescue University to travel to the South to rebuild shelters and provide transport of dogs to other communities where they have a better chance of being adopted.

Student volunteers from this program spend a week rehabilitating shelter facilities and improving the quality of life for the pets awaiting adoption.

Total Grants Awarded: \$45,000.00 for three trips to Animal Lifeline to assist four shelters.

Other Programs: The Foundation works with its corporate partners and funders to offer needed in-kind supplies or educational tools to Petfinder.com members.
